

## Organization of EIEF Graduate Program

2017 – 2018

There are three types of courses

- 1) Regular PhD courses
- 2) PhD course that will be part of RoME starting from the academic year 2018-2019
- 3) Short monographic courses

The courses will last 6 weeks and each course will have 15 classes of 90 minutes. Two classes per week will be courses and one class every two weeks where students will be asked to solve exercises or present papers.

Monographic course could be taught any time of the year and that consist of 3/5 lectures on specific topics taught over at least two weeks.

Every module will be followed by a mid-term break week and a week of exams.
